ADD-ON FEES FOR ULTRASOUND SESSIONS

Register for these ultrasound intensives as part of the Friday's RHC sessions.

The Hands-On Ultrasound Education (HOUSE) Program will offer three 2-hour intensives as part of the BC Rural Health Conference. Each session begins with a brief introduction to knobology and a bedside demonstration, followed by hands-on learning, in which participants practice their skills on live models. All intensives are taught by HOUSE instructors, with a 2:1 participant to instructor ratio.

HOUSE INTENSIVE: THE ABDOMEN

This two hour ultrasound workshop will include FAST, hydronephrosis, and aorta. For those who have not mastered the FAST exam, this intensive will offer lots of hands-on scanning time and is expected to markedly improve scanning competency. Those already competent with the FAST exam can learn POCUS for hydronephrosis and aorta, two applications that are very useful in the ER.

HOUSE INTENSIVE: ECTOPIC PREGNANCY & IVC

This two hour ultrasound workshop will include ectopic pregnancy (focused on the transabdominal approach with some coverage of transvaginal technique) and IVC. The ability to identify an intra-uterine pregnancy, and thus rule out ectopic pregnancy, is a GAMECHANGER for rural physicians faced with an unstable female patient with abdominal pain. This limited first trimester POCUS exam has been shown to significantly decrease the time to diagnosis and definitive treatment of ectopic pregnancy. The IVC scan can provide information regarding the volume status of your patient, and is useful for both diagnosing volume depletion and for monitoring response to fluid therapy.

HOUSE INTENSIVE: VASCULAR ACCESS & MSK

This two hour ultrasound workshop will include vascular access (central and peripheral lines) and MSK (fractures, joint effusion, foreign body, muscles, & tendons). Does the idea of inserting a central line make you sweat? It is very easy to learn how to locate the ideal insertion site for a central or peripheral vein catheter, and watch the needle go into the vein in real time, confirming placement. Learn to use ultrasound to improve your diagnostic accuracy of ruptured muscles and tendons, foreign body location, shoulder dislocation, hip joint effusion, joint aspirations, and for fracture diagnosis and during fracture reduction.
